Researching graphically allows you to plot, view and analyze data and relationships in more creative and visual ways. This methodology can help to identify inconsistent data or 'holes in the picture.'

Hypotheses and Research Questions

A hypothesis is a supposition - an educated guess for the sake of argument. Hypotheses are created to explain situations, and these hypotheses are then tested to see if they can be proven or disproven.

Example Hypothesis:	William Seabron and Alfred Smith are cousins.
Research Question:	Are William Seabron and Alfred Smith cousins?

Charts

Correlation is the process of comparing and contrasting genealogical information and evidence to reveal conflicts, similarities and patterns. Compiling a chart is useful in comparing information.


Spreadsheets & Timelines

Diagrams


Venn diagrams are used to teach probability, logic, and relationships. The diagrams consist of multiple or overlapping circles that can identify similarities and differences between things or people.
