# Roll Call! Researching Your Veteran Ancestors: Civil War, WWI and WWII

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# DRAFT RECORDS

## <u>Civil War</u>

There were four Civil War Drafts for Union forces that occurred between 1863-1865. The draft records are divided into three different classes.

- Class I: men 20-35 subject to military duty & unmarried men 36-44 subject to military duty
- Class II: married men 36-44
- Class III: volunteers.

## <u>WWI</u>

Over 24 million men registered for the U.S. Draft at the time of World War I over the course of three drafts.

Draft	Date	Persons Affected
First	June 5, 1917	Men, aged 21 to 31 years old
Second	June 5, 1918	Men who had reached the age of 21 since the 1917 registration
Third	Sept. 12, 1918	Men, aged 18 to 45

#### <u>WWII</u>

WWII Draft registrations for men born between February 17, 1897 to July 31, 1927 are available online from Ancestry.com and Fold3.com. If you do not find it currently online, you can obtain a copy from:

The fourth draft, conducted April 27, 1942, was for men born between the years 1877 and 1897. These men were the last line of defense, and often included many former World War I veterans. These draft cards can be searched and viewed online at FamilySearch.org and Fold3.com

**Note**: Even though a name might appear in the draft registrations, it does not confirm that they were drafted into the military service.

#### **SERVICE RECORDS**

#### <u>Civil War</u>

An index of veterans of the Union and Confederate forces can be search on the National Parks Service Civil War Soldiers System <u>https://www.nps.gov/civilwar/soldiers-and-sailors-</u> <u>database.htm.</u> Some service records are available on Fold3.com for various states.



## World War I and World War II

A fire in 1973 at the National Personnel Records Center in St. Louis, Missouri destroyed 16 to 18 million personnel records for the U.S. Army between (service years 1912 to 1960) and the U.S. Air Force (service years 1947 to 1964): <u>https://www.archives.gov/personnel-records-center/fire-1973</u>

Some surviving "burnt files" are available from the NPRC. Accessing records from various repositories including State Adjutant General or State Archives. These records can also be a valuable replacement for missing service records for WWI and WWII. U.S Marine Corps muster rolls are available online from Ancestry.com from 1798-1958.

Over 9 million enlistments for the U.S. Army between the years 1938 and 1946 are available online. These enlistments can be searched and viewed online at FamilySearch.org U.S. Navy muster rolls 1938-1949 are available from Ancestry.com

## PENSION RECORDS

## **Civil War Pensions**

**Union Pensions**: Most of the original pensions granted 1861-1934 to Union veterans are at the National Archives in Washington, D.C. These records are presently being digitized by Fold3.com. Currently some of the early Widow's pensions for the Army, as well as Navy Pensions are available on Fold3.com

**Confederate Pensions**: Confederate veterans could apply for a pension from the state they resided in, even if they served from a different state during the war.
